TRUSTEE EXCELLENCE FUND (TEF) REVIEW

WHAT IS THE TEF?

The TEF is the expendable fund that trustees contribute to. The pooled funds create a strong catalyst for innovation and impact at K-State.

You do as a trustee. Half of a trustee's \$5,000 annual commitment to K-State (\$2,500) is directed to the Trustees Excellence Fund.

TEF dollars are deployed to projects or programs that are emerging growth opportunities or addressing a student or campus need. The KSU Foundation identifies areas to receive funding in collaboration with university leaders.

The foundation is very strategic about how the TEF is utilized. Ultimately, we deploy these dollars to support programs that will generate the highest return on your philanthropic investment and directly impact students.

FLIP THIS CLASSROOM RENOVATIONS

If you walk into one of K-State's 275 classrooms today, there's a good chance the space might seem a little ... familiar. That's because many haven't been significantly updated in decades. Thanks to funding from the trustees, significant progress has been made to update 67 of K-State's most-used — and most outdated — classrooms. So far, 12 classrooms have been completed, with 16 more planned by the end of 2025.

APPLIED LEARNING EXPERIENCES

As a leading land-grant institution, we know that education beyond the classroom is essential to putting context to learning and sharing our knowledge with Kansas communities and beyond.

That's why providing applied learning experiences to every degree-seeking student is one of the strategic imperatives in K-State's Next-Gen Strategic Plan. From study abroad and research projects to internships and competition teams, these experiences apply classroom learning in real-world settings. They create opportunities for students to gain valuable insights, develop problem-solving abilities and better understand their career fields.

GAME-CHANGING RESEARCH INITIATION PROGRAM

The GRIP brings together interdisciplinary teams for transformative research on grand challenges facing Kansas stakeholders, our nation and world. A broad team of senior researchers and K-State academic leaders reviewed pre-proposals from 36 teams and invited 10 to submit full proposals. After review by faculty and academic leaders, projects from three teams were selected for funding of up to \$300k annually for up to three years, plus \$50k in one-time ramp-up funds. Money from the Trustees Excellence Fund contributed to this funding.

The teams from the funded projects include faculty members from five colleges and K-State Olathe.
